Information system for European public procurement

The SIMAP portal provides access to most important information about public procurement in Europe.

Tender notices are published on **TED** website, the single official source of public contracts in Europe. Most of public procurement notices are sent for publication through an electronic channel. A web-based tool — **eNotices** — simplifies and speeds up preparation and publication of tender notices. **eSenders** service allows qualified organisations to submit notices directly as XML files.

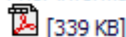

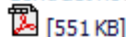

TED – Business opportunities in Europe

All public tenders above specific contract values must be published in the *Supplement to the Official Journal of the European Union (S series, Official Journal S or OJ S)* and published throughout the EU.

The *Official Journal S* is available exclusively in electronic format and is accessible:

Access to TED is free of charge.

In addition to current tenders, the TED database allows access to the archives for the past five years of the S series in all EU languages. A single search interface allows the user to select or to enter multiple search criteria, including geographical data, type of document, nature of contract, keywords and more.

What is TED?

TED (Tenders Electronic Daily) is the online version of the 'Supplement to the Official Journal of the European Union', dedicated to European public procurement.



How can I benefit from TED?

TED provides free access to business opportunities. It is updated five times a week with approximately 1500 public procurement notices from the European Union, the European Economic Area and beyond.

You can browse, search and sort procurement notices by country, region, business sector and more.

Information about every procurement document is published in the 23 official EU languages. All notices from the European Union's institutions are published in full in these languages.



Why should I register on TED?

- To access the entire content of TED, including the archive.
- To personalise search profiles, according to your needs.
- To get e-mail alerts based on your search profiles.
- To personalise RSS feeds for your web sites and RSS readers.
- Registration and usage of TED is absolutely free, and will remain so.

Sending XML notices

You can send public procurement notices in a structured electronic format, using the online forms available on this portal or by providing XML files to the Publications Office.

How to become an OJS eSender

To become an OJS eSender there is a three-phase procedure, consisting of acceptance of your project, testing and production.

Project acceptance

The Publications Office will ask you for a project plan, including:

If you plan to send notices on behalf of contracting entities, the Office would also like to receive:

We also need your assurance that we would only receive one copy of every notice, that notices will include CPV coding, etc. XML files sent for publication must conform to the DTD (Document Type Description) or Schema as defined and provided by the Office. The Publications Office provides software developers with comprehensive documentation for creating their own applications. Please read first the documents describing general and administrative procedures. These documents are currently available only in English.

Technical documents, including DTDs, are available on CIRCA, a website for communication between the EU institutions and their partners. Access to these documents is provided to registered users. Please see the document "How to access CIRCA" ([PDF](#) [370 KB]) for registration information.

Overview of the test phases

Please note that you will need approximately one month for each of the test phases. You will receive a report with detailed analysis for every test notice. You should use an XML parser to validate all files before transmitting them the Publications Office, who also provides an online viewer/parser for testing the XML notices.

If you plan to send notices on behalf of contracting authorities, and to avoid duplications, it is very important that notices are not sent both by the awarding authorities and the OJS eSender.

- The CPV establishes a single classification system for public procurement aimed at standardising the references used by contracting authorities and entities to describe the subject of procurement contracts. The CPV, adopted by Regulation (EC) No. 213/2008 is in use since 17/09/2008.
- The Nomenclature of Territorial Units for Statistics (NUTS) was established by Eurostat in order to provide a single uniform breakdown of territorial units for the production of regional statistics for the European Union.
- The central product classification (CPC) is a classification established by the United Nations based on the physical characteristics of goods or on the nature of the services rendered.
